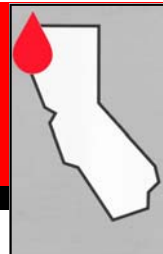

Donors Urged to "Share the Health"



Long Time Blood Donors **Jim and Nell Hamm**

"It's so important that people donate blood " Jim Hamm says "people take for granted that there will be blood available when it's needed, and you never know when you or someone in your family will need it." After he was attacked by a 6½ foot mountain lion a year ago it was Jim Hamm who needed it.

The attack, reported on around the world, happened while he, and his wife Nell, were hiking at Prairie Creek Redwoods State Park.

After fighting off the mountain lion, Nell helped Jim walk for 1/3 a mile to Drury Parkway where she flagged down a Conservation Camp crew and sent them for help. It was then that Nell realized how much blood Jim had lost. He was stabilized and rushed in the ambulance to Mad River Community Hospital where he received Red Blood Cells. He received 2 more units of RBCs while being flown to California Pacific Medical Center in San Francisco, and used even more blood products during his multiple surgeries there. These micro-surgeries, developed at CPMC, used needles and thread so small that they are invisible to the naked eye.

Nell and Jim talk about the support they have received from the community and the medical staff here and in San Francisco, some of whom have "become like family". But long before they were in a position to need that support they were helping others in their communities as blood donors, in Ventura County and now in Humboldt.

"We've always felt that donating blood was a personal responsibility. It's not always fun" say's Nell "but it's critically important."

Nell and Jim realize that the need for blood products is constant. Whether blood products are used for patients in emergencies, for surgeries and long term treatments or sent to other facilities to avoid out-dating, the supply of platelets, plasma and red cells, is in need of constant replenishment.

Though this was the fight of their lives and Jim considers himself lucky to be alive, the couple are back in the forest, in the mountains and on the beaches of Humboldt County and enjoying every day of their lives together.

Administrator's View

Northern California Community Blood Bank works daily toward our mission, which is to provide a safe and adequate supply of blood to the patients we serve. The mission has however, become ever more difficult because the cumulative impact of safety requirements by regulatory agencies impacts the adequacy of the blood supply. Essentially, more donors are deferred for more and more reasons.

It is no surprise to us that a recent study published in "Transfusion" reported the estimates of the number of eligible donors in this country is far less than what has always been stated by the experts. Instead of over 100,000,000 citizens being eligible to give blood, only 33,000,000 are actually eligible. Projecting those numbers to Humboldt and Del Norte counties would indicate that instead of having nearly 60,000 eligible donors in our two county area, a bit less than 20,000 citizens are actually eligible to give blood.

New deferrals, additional tests, tighter screening all have combined to reduce the number of available donors. The blood supply has never been safer, but when regulations require that blood centers defer donors who are actually safe donors, we may risk more lives because of the lack of an adequate blood supply than the risk of disease transmission from transfusions. We are not quite at that point yet, but the effort and cost to recruit enough donors to meet patient needs continues to escalate.

Some of our wonderful community donors are also beginning to ask why we need to call them so often. The fact is we need to call our previous donors if we are going to have enough blood available to meet the needs of the patients we serve. We actually wish we did not have to call at all but if we do not call previous donors, we will not have an adequate blood supply.

NCCBB continues to have donors willing to give at nearly 3 times the national average and we are very proud of our donors and community for being so willing to save lives of patients they do not know by giving blood and by sponsoring blood drives throughout Humboldt and Del Norte counties.

So on behalf of the mother who needed 18 units of blood to save her own life after the birth of her beautiful daughter, the recent liver transplant patient at Stanford Medical Center that NCCBB donors helped support, our local cancer patients and heart patients who have needed the platelets from our Automated Blood Collection program, and Jim and Nell Hamm who are still sharing life together because of the generous gifts of life from you, our committed donors, thank you for your generosity and commitment. These patients as well as the staff, volunteers and Board of Directors of the Northern California Community Blood Bank, appreciate your gifts of life. We are honored to be your stewards of a safe and adequate blood supply.

Meanwhile, the blood bank continues to invest in technology to enhance our ability to provide the right blood product, to the right patient, at the right time and to meet the every increasing regulatory requirements. In the last two years we have purchased walk in refrigerators and freezers, a device that irradiates units of blood to reduce the risk of Graft vs Host disease for immune compromised patients, a new, upgraded state of the art 24 hour per day temperature monitoring system for all blood storage equipment, an upgraded computer system, wireless connectivity on bloodmobiles, and a remodeled storage, distribution and conference area to name a few of the investments. Donors within the next few months will be receiving new wallet cards

which will permit us to eliminate the paper donor registration and medical history forms as we not only will be wireless, but also hopefully, paperless. The Board of Directors continues to evaluate all equipment needs as well as when we may need an expanded facility.

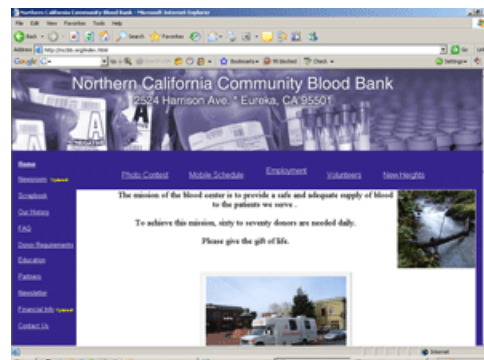
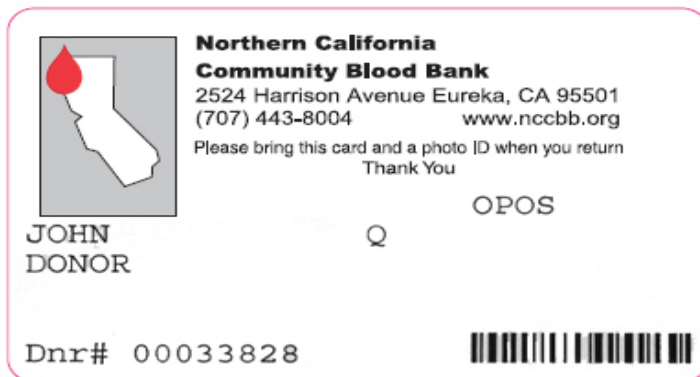

Inspectors Like What They See

NCCBB is proud of the fact we have successfully passed several inspections in the last year. The AABB, formerly known as the American Association of Blood Banks has given us our accreditation for another two years. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration also inspected us for a week this past summer with no negative findings. In January, 2008, we had a positive inspection from the California Department of Health Services. We also had visits from the State of California Pressure Vessel Inspection Unit which looked at our emergency generator fuel storage, the Humboldt County HazMat which looked at the same thing. The State of California Hazardous Waste Management Unit inspected our handling of our waste and we continue to meet all of their requirements. We expect the European Union to come for inspection of our processes for producing plasma products sometime in 2008. If it seems like we have many inspections and regulations, it is because we do have many inspections and regulations. It is our responsibility however, to make sure we meet or exceed the regulations required of us and we are proud to say we do.





New T.R.A.L.I. Measures May Allow Re-entry of Some Donors

A recent example of the issue related to adequacy of the blood supply relates to the recommendation in 2006 by AABB, formerly American Association of Blood Banks, to reduce the risk of Transfusion Related Acute Lung Injury (TRALI) by not producing plasma and platelet products from female donors. NCCBB converted many men to Automated Blood Collections (ABC) and attempted to have women who had been ABC donors become whole blood donors.

Because we were one of the first blood centers in the country to implement a TRALI risk reduction strategy, we were asked to make a presentation regarding our successes and concerns with the processes we put in place to reduce the risk of Transfusion Related Lung Injury (TRALI). Our own Bob LaLonde, Director of Donor Services, made a presentation at the recent national AABB meeting and will be making two more presentations to members of the California Blood Bank Society and will explain the steps we have taken to reduce the risk as well as the impact on the safety and adequacy of the blood supply.

At the AABB Meeting, Mr. LaLonde spoke in front of over 500 people from transfusion services and blood banks from all over the United States and Canada. He stated we have successfully made a transition to platelets and plasma only from male donors. He reported that many women who had been donating platelets and plasma are continuing to give blood as whole blood donors.

Although we have been successful in reducing the risk of TRALI, our major concern is that we have lost some donors and our overall blood donations are down, particularly among female donors. Current information shows that the frequency of donation among female donors who had been giving by ABC methods, is down 65%. We believe long term, the amount of blood available locally and to share with other blood centers will be reduced. It is also a concern that the blood inventory we have available is also much smaller than it has been in recent years. We are not in a crisis shortage situation as long as donors continue to give, but we are concerned for the long term if more deferral and limitations are imposed by regulatory agencies.

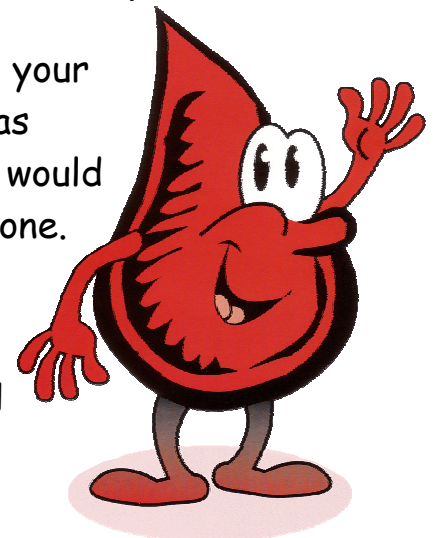
NCCBB believes it is important to once again clarify our policy related to donations by women and to update on the likelihood of testing to again permit female donors as ABC donors. We want to emphasize, women are critically needed to give whole blood and the whole blood donated by our female donors is nearly always made into at least three blood products that patients need. Female donors continue to be absolutely essential to the adequacy of the blood supply. From the donations made by our women donors, we are able to produce red blood cells, cryoprecipitate and a plasma product that is utilized in the manufacture of Serum Albumin, IVIG, or Antihemophilic Factor for example.

We also need for men to continue to donate whole blood but we also want men to consider becoming a platelet or plasma donor via our Automated Blood Collection devices. Both women and men are needed as donors because our goal is to have the right blood product donated at the right time, by the right donor. We will also be asking some eligible donors to give a double red blood cell.

Lastly related to the TRALI issue, we are involved in discussions nationally regarding which tests could be developed and ultimately utilized to screen donors and thereby reduce the risk of TRALI via a test, rather than by exclusion. It appears that by the end of the first quarter of 2008, a HLA test will be available that will permit us to bring some women back as ABC Platelet donors. We are committed to implementing such test as soon as it is available. We will be contacting our women donors who had been giving by Automated Blood Collection methods in the past, as soon as a test is available. Stay tuned.

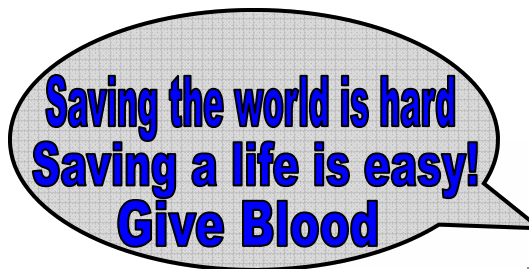

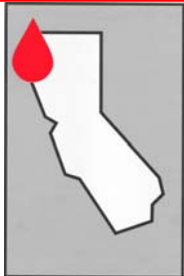
Our Wonderful Blood Drive Sponsors
